President's Message

Facts, Hearsay and the Internet

One needs to be very careful when collecting information about art materials, particularly on the internet. For example, I have been investigating watercolours lately, and have been fascinated by the huge variety of opinions on the matter. In some ways it seems to me that the people who speak the loudest, are often those who know the least.

In order to illustrate this, I will use the results of my own investigation. I have been looking at the difference between student and artist grade watercolour paint, in particular Winsor & Newton's Cotman paint (which is considered "student" grade) and their "artist" grade paint. As someone who was a research scientist his entire working life, I wanted to find out the truth. They publish huge amounts of technical information about their products for those who are interested.

Many people tell you that Cotman paints will fade in time. In fact they all have an AST M rating of I or II. There are some W&N Artist grade paints which have lower ratings. Next they will tell you that Cotman paints are made of inferior pigments. In fact most Cotman paints are made of the same pigments as the Artist quality paints. People will tell you to never use colours called hues as these are inferior pigments. Cotman Cadmium Yellow hues do not contain cadmium pigments, but one or two pigments mixed together to look like Cadmium. If you look closer though, the individual pigments that are mixed together, are themselves artist quality pigments, and are used separately in the artist quality line of paints.

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President's Message, cont'd

People will also tell you that the artist quality paints are always single pigments. Not true again. There are many W&N artist quality paints that are made of 2 and sometimes 3 pigments. Colour charts of many varieties of watercolour paints done by Teoh Yi Chie on YouTube (internet video channel) clearly show that Cotman, although not the equivalent of the W&N artist paints in terms of saturation, the differences can be subtle. Cotman paints are much better than the average student grade paint, and the equal of many artist quality paints of other companies. Finally, I looked at the incredible watercolour portraits of a famous Chinese artist who uses only Cotman paints, and was completely blown away by his work. Take a look at his work at http://www.guanweixing.com/

It seems to me that the real difference between Cotman and Artist Quality paints is probably the amount of grinding of the pigments which is expensive, and the concentration of pigments in each tube of paint.

This is not an advertisement for Cotman Watercolour Paint. It is however an example of the amount of misinformation that there is out there, and a warning to be very careful of claims regarding artist materials. When you get information off the internet, check the source of the information, and ask yourself who is making the claim. Too many people, including so called "experts", make statements with very little real information, because that's what they were taught, and so the myths carry on. It seems to me that this is the case not only with artist materials, but with many more important things in our lives. Without the right information, we can't possibly make the right decisions. In the end you need to find out for yourself.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has helped to make this year interesting for all BFAA members. Have a very Merry Christmas and please drive carefully.





- Free rentals may be booked a MAXIMUM of 30 days in advance.
- Free rentals are available only during regular operating hours of the AGB

If you wish to exhibit, please send me a short Bio of your exhibits. You must have been accepted in at least TWO Juried Exhibitions. You must wait 3 years before exhibiting again in the Fireside Lounge. You must also have been a member of Fine Arts and AGB for at least one year.

When you exhibit in the Fireside you are required to sign a statement that you will pay 20% commission to the BFAA for anything that is sold while it is hanging there, and also for any painting sold afterwards within the month after the show is down, based on the purchaser having seen it at the Fireside Lounge. The BFAA keeps 10% and gives 10% to the Arts Burlington Council. It is up to the artists to be on their honour and pay the 20% commission to our Treasurer.
