Duchamps turned a readymade urinal into a piece of art still showing in galleries, and John Cage presented a piece of music in which the musician sat in front of the piano and played nothing at all for 4 minutes and 33 seconds; complete silence except for the sounds of the audience and the street outside the theatre. You can purchase a recording of this. And these outliers soon became what many artists aspired to, and began to produce. Even raw meat is used in some pieces. Soon the idea became more important than whether the artist had any skill in the actual production of the piece or not. I can't help but wonder in 100 years or more, what people will think of all this. Will these pieces stand the test of time as does the invention of the printing press, the steam engine, antibiotics, or the harnessing of electricity? Will there be a return to skill and virtuosity, a hankering for days gone by? Will a little boy cry out that the emperor has no clothes? I don't know where it is all going. One thing for sure, it will go somewhere, as there is only one constant in life, and that is change. In fact life itself is change starting from the time we are born until the time of our death. Just look in the mirror if you dare. And it's speeding up. There was a time when thousands of years would go by before a small change in the way things were done was accepted. Today a cell phone is obsolete before you receive the Visa bill for your new acquisition.

President's Message, cont'd

There are many changes coming to the Burlington Art Centre (BAC) over the next year, many which will affect the Burlington Fine Arts Association. In order to help the public understand that we are a separate organization from the Burlington Performing Arts Centre, the BAC will be rebranding itself this year with a new name.

Also, there have been many staffing changes at the BAC. Some people have moved on, and other positions have become redundant as new directions for the Centre are beginning.

The seven Guilds that make their home at the BAC are the biggest users of the facilities, and will be asked to increase their contribution to the utility fund to keep the lights on in the building. Note that it costs more than \$1,000 a day to keep the building going. As you know, electricity prices are going up for everyone in Ontario. Therefore, in June 2014 the cost of a one year membership in the BFAA will go up by \$10 per member to \$50 for seniors and \$55 for non-seniors. Of this amount, we send \$30 to the Art Centre for each BFAA member, leaving \$20/\$25 for our Guild activities. This amount, \$20/\$25 has not changed in many years and will remain the same for now. Remember that you must be a member of the BAC in order to be a member of the BFAA.



If you wish to exhibit, please send me a short Bio of your exhibits. You must have been accepted in at least TWO Juried Exhibitions. You must wait 3 years before exhibiting again in the Fireside Gallery. You must also have been a member of Fine Arts for at least one year as well as the BAC.

When you exhibit in the Fireside you are required to sign a statement that you will pay 20% commission to the BFAA for anything that is sold while it is hanging there, and also for any painting sold afterwards within the month after the show is down, based on the purchaser having seen it at the Fireside Gallery. The BFAA keeps 10% and gives 10% to the Arts Burlington Council. It is up to the artists to be on their honour and pay the 20% commission to our Treasurer.
