Executive Sketches

For my turn at the writing desk, I will tackle that most elusive component of art: COLOUR! As Paul Klee aptly said, "Colour is the irrational element in painting; it is mysterious, a suggestive power" – "it is at once science and pure emotion."

Treatises have been written, studies conducted, prism gradation calibrated, and pigments chemically engineered. Whether saturated or thinned, sparingly or lavishly used, colour is everywhere and it affects us directly. From time immemorial, artists have collected, mixed, and used colour in varying fashion. Understanding colour theory can help you bring your composition to its purest form of expression. Expand or restrict your palette; give in to values, gradation, dissonance and texture. Allow yourself to be intuitive when handling colour. It is a very personal thing! There is no right or wrong. When an artwork successfully celebrates colour, I say "it sings."

Being an artist means we must constantly observe the world, but we must also "let it go" - find new ways of looking at old things, learn new techniques. YOU must decide what is important and make it visible. Whether you record all you see or purge to the barest essentials – be brave! make brash choices, no one will die. As you paint, let your inner child spar with your controlling self, have those conversations with yourself. In your shifting adventures, colour is your friend – in my case, it is my muse.

Want to get out of your comfort zone? Come out to Sketch Group, Abstract Group and Print Group; develop new skills, meet other artists and let yourself shine! Yours truly,

MY WORK:

- Thursday March 9: Provide price lists for sale items and insurance values for works not for sale.
- Friday April 21, 5pm 7pm: Reception for All Guilds Show.
- Tuesday May 23, 9am 9pm: Pick up all works. Any work left after May 31, 2017 will be disposed of.

Please note that the AGB will receive a 20% commission for sold works in the All Guilds Show, with the exception of the kaleidoscope Sale weekend. Works in the All Guilds Show that are sold April 22-23, 2017 will have the 20% commission go the Arts Burlington.



The conditions are as follows:

- 1 free rental per exhibition
- Maximum free rental duration is 3 hours
- Free rentals may be booked a MAXIMUM of 30 days in advance.
- Free rentals are available only during regular operating hours of the AGB

If you wish to exhibit in 2018, please send me a short Bio and 5 images of your current work for review.. You must have been accepted in at least TWO BFAA Juried Exhibitions or Curated Shows. You must wait 4 years before exhibiting again in the Fireside Lounge. You must also have been a member of Fine Arts and AGB for at least one year.

When you exhibit in the Fireside you are required to sign a statement that you will pay 20% commission to the BFAA for anything that is sold while it is hanging there, and also for any painting sold afterwards within the month after the show is down, based on the purchaser having seen it at the Fireside Lounge. The BFAA keeps 10% and gives 10% to the Arts Burlington Council. It is up to the artists to be on their honour and pay the 20% commission to our Treasurer.
