President's Message

Living in the Moment

For those Plein Air painters that look forward to painting snow in the winter, this has been a good year, except for the extremely cold temperatures, but then snow doesn't fall in warm weather. One day I was out painting on a beautiful sunny day and when I thought I had done as much as possible I looked up and realized that I had been there almost two hours. When I got home I found that I was chilled to the bone, and it took me a couple of hours sitting by the fireplace to warm up. I guess this is an example of being in the moment and completely absorbed in what you are doing and being unaware of anything else including the cold.

Watching the Olympics this year, I noticed the concentration of the athletes, particularly just before they started their performance, or race. In interviews, many of them talked about time standing still and being in the zone, not particularly aware that they were at the Olympics or that they had an audience. It is the act of performance, or process of painting that is important, and not the final product. Although it may seem counter intuitive, it seems to me that when you abandon the concept of achieving a good painting and just enjoy the process, you end up with your best results. I think this is the feeling that makes artists say that they paint or make art because they have to.

The BFAA will celebrate its 50th anniversary in 2016. We are planning a major show in the large Lee Chin Gallery. Although some have suggested it, the show will not be a retrospective look to the past of the BFAA.

Acceptable works for this room are:


- unframed original paintings to a maximum of 22" x 28"

Self Portrait

R. David Foster achieved an Honours Diploma in Art Fundamentals from Sheridan College in 1993 before entering their Classical Animation program the same year. It turned out that his Art Fundamentals Instructor's advice to not go into animation was wiser than he appreciated.

In 2006, however, on the advice of the Executive Director at the Liason of Independent Film of Toronto, David successfully applied for two of three grants to complete a 35mm, 6 minute animated film entitled **HYPOTHERMIA / My Kayak Prayer** which he completed in 2008, while working full time as a landscape maintenance worker.

Since then he has continued to paint watercolours, with artwork selected for the Touched By Fire art show and sale twice in the last 3 years, and has completed 5 episodes of his animated series entitled **HESUS JOY CHRIST** as well as a book discussing the issues presented in this animation.

Currently David is an active volunteer in the Oakville and Burlington communities, having received a Burlington Accessibility Award in 2013. Although very busy, David is attempting to maintain production on a sixth episode of animation, which began in 2010.



If you wish to have an opening in the Fireside Lounge, you must contact Angi to book the room. I believe the fee is \$75.00

If you wish to exhibit, please send me a short Bio of your exhibits. You must have been accepted in at least TWO Juried Exhibitions. You must wait 3 years before exhibiting again in the Fireside Gallery. You must also have been a member of Fine Arts for at least one year as well as the BAC.

When you exhibit in the Fireside you are required to sign a statement that you will pay 20% commission to the BFAA for anything that is sold while it is hanging there, and also for any painting sold afterwards within the month after the show is down, based on the purchaser having seen it at the Fireside Gallery. The BFAA keeps 10% and gives 10% to the Arts Burlington Council. It is up to the artists to be on their honour and pay the 20% commission to our Treasurer.
