Do you have the time?

I have been reflecting on the question, "How do you make the time for your art?" Artists seem to have a varied answer to this question because making the time goes hand in hand with its companions: space and self-discipline.

Time: Master artists will tell us, we need to find the time to paint every day. But how? There are some artists I know in this group who get up at the crack of dawn and paint religiously for 4 hours before their significant other awakes. Their art is the most important thing, besides their spouse, so they make sure it is completed each and every day. There are some artists who paint when the kids head off to school. Some of us have had such demanding jobs and careers and have had to put our art on the back burner until after retirement. Some artists "steal time" and try to fit it in while making dinner, after the kids or grandkids have gone to bed, or between loads of laundry. Whatever your situation, committing to the time to make art is our first hurdle as artists. Many have found the solution by hanging a virtual "do not disturb" sign, identifying to our friends and family that they need to allow us a commitment to a particular routine time or day of the week to artistically "work out". This introduces the second hurdle: space.

Place: Where do you do your art? Some of us have carved out a space in the spare room after junior has finally left home. Some of us have indulgent, supportive spouses who allow us to take over the living room for our studio space because it has better light. Some of us work on the kitchen table in our condo.

For a lot of us, we are most productive when we are outside the house, away from the siren calls of laundry and emails, and are able to focus in a studio. Therefore, in order to focus and be the most productive, just like going to the gym, our time commitment must include travel time to the studio and home.

Self-discipline: Finally, the last part of the equation is self-discipline. One can have the space and time but not the perseverance, self-motivation and ability to shut the door on self-doubt and insecurity, face the blank canvas and JUST DO IT!

I have asked several artists how they keep up their momentum and one told me that when she gets up in the morning she puts on her painting clothes (you know, the ones with the paint stains that never come out but are the most comfortable...). Just like putting on your workout clothes you have told yourself you are following through on your agenda.

Many artists approach working on their art the same way some of us approach weight loss, tell as many of your friends and family what you are doing, and that way to save face you will follow through on your goal.

Personally, I have found that, like getting into that little black dress for New Year's, nothing motivates like a deadline. It is helpful to have a deadline that I can break down into mini deadlines (like having a painting done a month early for the catalogue photo shoot). Therefore, thank you to the BFAA and the Art Gallery of Burlington. You have provided a wonderful studio space, supportive art friends and regular deadlines to help to nudge me to meet my painting goals. The rest is really up to me and that canvas.

This exhibition will showcase **different facets of the self-portrait**. You are invited to submit an artwork that represents either you or an aspect of you. The familiar head and shoulders portraits are not excluded, but we are hoping for something different. The poet Hopkins invented the word "inscape" for an image that is the opposite of a landscape: a look inward at ourselves, and it's this quality we would like to see – however you interpret it.

Chief Curator **Denis Longchamps** invites the Members of the Burlington Fine Arts Association to explore our theme and submit one work towards this fun and challenging exhibition. All approaches and mediums are welcome!

Timeline:

- First, Members intending to participate need to send Denis Longchamps (denis@agb.life) an email with BFAA "SELF BY SELF" 2018 in the subject line; and copy (info@dominiqueprevost.com) on it. This will give us an idea of how many participants to expect.
- From **NOW until September 2018**: Create the artwork. Denis Longchamps will make himself available to discuss, follow up and support the development of the works.
- **September 15, 2018**: Deliver the finished work ready to be photographed, and a short statement about it. **October 2018**, the professional proofs, texts and layout of the brochure are ready for print.
- Exhibition dates: NOVEMBER 2018, AGB RBC GALLERY
- Private opening celebration for BFAA Members with a Guess the Artist contest (TBD)

- One work per Member: 2D or 3D works in any media, no diptych or triptych, installation OK.
- Maximum size restriction is 36" x 36" x 36" frame included.
- Material to provide A short statement about "why this is my inscape," label information with name, title, media and price (for sale or NFS)

- Plates with names and description
- Acknowledgements



If you wish to have an opening in the Fireside Lounge, you must contact Angi Goobie to book the room.

The conditions are as follows:

- 1 free rental per exhibition
- Maximum free rental duration is 3 hours
- Free rentals may be booked a MAXIMUM of 30 days in advance.
- Free rentals are available only during regular operating hours of the AGB

If you wish to exhibit in 2018, please send me a short Bio and 5 images of your current work for rreview. You must have been accepted in at least TWO BFAA Juried Exhibitions or Curated Shows. You must wait 4 years before exhibiting again in the Fireside Lounge. You must also have been a member of Fine Arts and AGB for at least one year.

When you exhibit in the Fireside you are required to sign a statement that you will pay 20% commission to the BFAA for anything that is sold while it is hanging there, and also for any painting sold afterwards within the month after the show is down, based on the purchaser having seen it at the Fireside Lounge.

The BFAA keeps 10% and gives 10% to the Arts Burlington Council. It is up to the artists to be on their honour and pay the 20% commission to our Treasurer.
