# **President's Message**

#### **Art and Nature**

I painted a lot of boats this summer, finding myself in many different locations where boats dominated the landscape. Boats have always given me trouble, and I have tended to avoid painting them in the past. They shouldn't be any harder than anything else, but for some reason I had a mental block when it came to boats. I think I was seeing them as my preconceived idea of a boat as opposed to a series of shapes, colour and forms. This type of thinking is often a problem for artists.

Painting this or any subject from life, or plein air, makes all the difference in the world. It is an exercise in experiencing things as they actually are. You would think after evolving for millions of years in the natural world we would be very much attuned to our environment, but it appears to me that people are less and less connected to their natural surroundings. We live in cities and nature is somewhere out there, only to be experienced on weekends, if at all. Without a very real understanding and connection to our natural environment, I think humans will run into trouble. For example, look what happened when a city like Calgary was built too close to the Bow River, and the river did what it naturally does under heavy rains combined with the melting snowpack in the mountains. It will take years for the surrounding area to recover from the huge flood. I think Plein Air Painting is an exercise in experiencing and making a connection with the environment which we need if we are to continue a comfortable existence on this small planet we call home.

Now, back to painting boats. There is still time to come out and join us plein air painting this season. Our schedule is on our website.



## **BFAA "Art Discussion" Continued**

#### **Editor's Note:**

In the April 2013 issue of the newsletter I included emails between several of our members concerning their thoughts about the importance of art. In July, Lois Crawford sent the following to Don Graves to continue the discussion.

Hi Don.

A thought:

It's actually many younger artists that are stuck on realism but then they haven't worked long enough to get bored with it and take it a step further to ... could be, surrealism or a total break into abstraction. The facts are that if they want to sell in THIS area, or perhaps anywhere, people like to understand immediately what they are looking at ... no thinking required!

With abstraction it is often the colour that you fall in love with (or don't), and the way it is used.

ie. <u>Chris Bacon</u> has worked at <u>realism</u> in painting birds since he was 17 (for over 25 years), and he's made a name for himself, internationally, in the wildlife art world. It was his passion and he stuck with it.

On the other hand <u>Peter Kirkland</u>, an abstractionist extraordinaire for over 20 years has won accolades and exhibitions but his name is not widely known.

Yet his technique is fine, his knowledge deep, not a rough spot in the lot.

#### **Age-old Question:**

Do you paint what you know will sell, or do you paint with the conviction of passion?

Many years ago, the President of OAAG (Ontario Association of Art Galleries), told BFAA members at a meeting where he was the invited speaker, that once an artist achieves success in a certain style or approach, it can be the kiss of death, because they are doomed to continue doing the same thing. The galleries ask for it because it sells and the artist ends up in a rut.

If you wish to have an opening in the Fireside Lounge, you must contact Lenore Lowe to book the room.

I believe the fee is \$75.00

If you wish to exhibit, please send me a short Bio of your exhibits. You must have been accepted in at least TWO Juried Exhibitions. You must wait 3 years before exhibiting again in the Fireside Gallery. You must also have been a member of Fine Arts for at least one year as well as the BAC.

When you exhibit in the Fireside you are required to sign a statement that you will pay 20% commission to the BFAA for anything that is sold while it is hanging there, and also for any painting sold afterwards within the month after the show is down, based on the purchaser having seen it at the Fireside Gallery. The BFAA keeps 10% and gives 10% to the Arts Burlington Council. It is up to the artists to be on their honour and pay the 20% commission to our Treasurer.
